At President Lincoln's Cottage, we value curiosity. Asking difficult questions and seeking answers, however murky, in search of glimmers of truth is what informs our Cottage tours specifically, our programming broadly, and of course, our podcast Q&Abe.

2022 began with some important questions: "How can we turn this hidden gem, this national treasure, into something less hidden and more iconic? How can we engage more people with the true spirit of the Lincolns? How do we best serve our surrounding community? And how do we build empathy and connection through the stories we tell?"

Dear Friends,

Thank you for your support of this unique National Monument, which continues to teach us the power of reflection, the importance of self-improvement, and the triumph of hope.

With your support during 2022, the Cottage:

- **Received outstanding recognition in the field**, including a History in Progress award from the American Association for State and Local History for our special exhibit *Reflections on Grief and Child Loss*. With this award, we join a small group of organizations to receive this special recognition for projects that are highly inspirational, exhibit exceptional scholarship, or are exceedingly entrepreneurial.
- **Offered fun, creative, and insightful programming**. Both Bourbon & Bluegrass and Homecoming set all-time records for attendance in 2022! We were proud to collaborate with the Smithsonian's National Museum of African Art and Howard University in preparation for our special installation, *Create to Free Yourselves* by Georges Adéagbo.
- **Conducted critical preservation work**. With the initial restoration of the Cottage seventeen years behind us, our director of preservation has been hard at work making necessary repairs both inside and out. These include restoring the veranda and south balcony, and masonry repairs to keep the 181-year-old structure sound.
- **Brought people together to consider big ideas in the spirit of Abraham Lincoln**. March 2022 was our busiest to date, where we welcomed more than 3,000 school children onsite for tours and educational programming.

Often called a "hidden gem", the Cottage is breaking out and bringing this special place to more people than ever before. As you'll see later in this report, we had an 206% increase in articles mentioning the Cottage, with prominent features in *Washingtonian*, *The Washington Post*, NBC, Fox5 News, CBS, WETA, and C-SPAN.

Plus, season four of our podcast, Q&Abe, reached audiences across the globe and tackled real visitor questions, including: "Was Lincoln Racist?", "Where's all the furniture?" and, "Did Lincoln Ever Play Basketball?"

Lincoln's legacy, like the work of the Cottage, is still unfolding. There are many more questions to be asked, stories to be told, and people to be comforted and inspired.

We look forward to seeing the Cottage reach new heights in the years to come, inspired, as ever, by our greatest president.

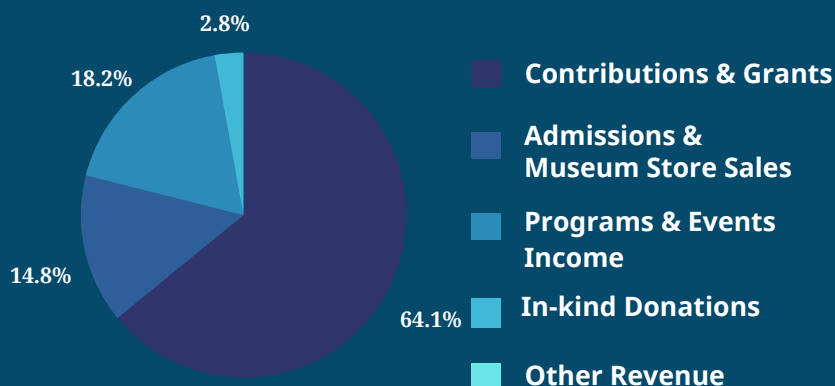

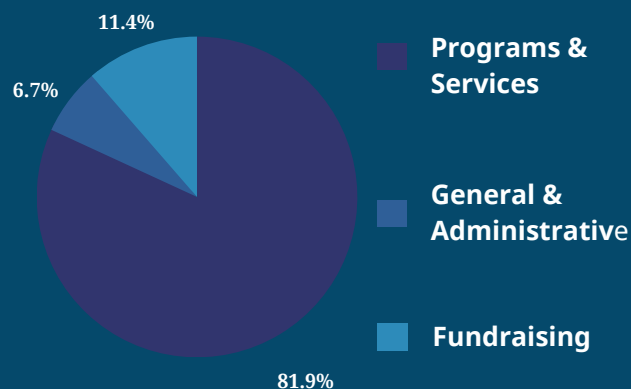
